

The Edward T. Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program provides financial aid to:

- o Sons, daughters, stepchildren, or the surviving spouse (who has not remarried) of a member of the United States Armed Forces who died as a result of military service or who suffered a 100% permanent disability as result of military service.
- o A student veteran who suffers a disability of 25% or greater as a result of military service, and has exhausted or is no longer eligible for federal veterans' educational benefits;
- o A POW/MIA of the Vietnam Conflict or his/her son, daughter, or stepchild

Awards may be held for five years of fulltime (12 or more undergraduate credits per semester or 9 or more graduate credits per semester) or eight years of parttime (6-11 undergraduate credits per semester or 6-8 graduate credits per semester) attendance or a combination of both. Recipients may attend at either the undergraduate or the graduate level. Audited courses cannot be used to reach the minimum credits hours required for fulltime or part-time status.

Application Process: Initially applicants for the scholarship must submit the Edward T. Conroy Memorial Scholarship application form **with all required documentation**, and it must be **received** by **July 15, 2024**. Late applications will be considered as long as funds are available.

Selection Awards are made annually, with renewal applicants given priority. Initial applicants will be awarded based on the postmarked date of their **completed** application by **July 15, 2024**.
