

2+2 Agreement

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This section outlines the courses which students must take for general education and program requirements in order to complete both the associate's and bachelor's degrees within a total of 4 years and 120 credits. Students who do not take the courses at Cecil College as outlined here are not guaranteed completion of the bachelor's degree in 2 years.
