GENERAL EDUCATION

The following information explains the transfer of students' general education courses:

TU will recognize the courses in Table 1 (see section 1) as a completed general education program. Students will receive a core package that satisfies most of the TU Core Curriculum with**a**t the need for course-by-course placement in specific Core Curriculum requirements.

Students will only need to complete two Core Curriculum requirements at TU: Advanced Writing Seminar (Core 9) and Ethical Perspectives (Core 14). If an ethics is taken as of the Arts & Humanities requirements at CSM students will complete a different requirement than Core 14.

LOWER-LEVEL EQUIVALENTS OF UPPER-LEVEL COURSES

A course number beginning with F indicates that it is a lowerlevel equivalent of an upper-level TU course. COMM F77 Intercultural Communication will satisfy a major requirement but will not count toward the TU degree requirement for 32 upper-level units.
